

How the Lottery System Works

1. Student Number

Every student in the lottery is given a number. This number will be a representation of that student. These students are full applicants only. Siblings and Legacy are not included in this lottery.

2. How to read the lottery numbers

After the lottery has taken place, which will take approx. 10 seconds, a screen similar to this one will be displayed. P1= will signify the students placement number. The number beside the place marker signifies your student.

For example, if John Smith is number 6 he would have the third placement in the lottery.
