Monday (9/6)

Labor Day holiday - no school

Tuesday (9/7)

American government (1st and 4th blocks) - Discuss the structure of our court system and how it applies to our essential question.

Homework: Start working on the assignment for *Just Mercy*

World History (2nd block) - the students will brainstorm on the phrase "Age of Anxiety" and discuss essential questions for our new unit. Students will read about the Great Depression and make an annotated timeline about the Great Depression.

Wednesday (9/8)

American government (1st and 2nd block): The students will have a quiz on English documents and early American governments. The students can use the foldables that they made in Wednesday's class the week before. Next the students will read the Declaration of Independence and rewrite it in their own words.

World history (4th block): The students will map the Safavid Empire and then create a tour guide book about the empire.

World history (2nd block): The students will research artists, writers and psychologists of the early 20th century and apply how their works applied to the uncertainty of the world in which they lived.
