Purpose: High School Portfolio is a course that provides reinforcement of Art 1 & 2 concepts through a multi-media experience. In addition, diving further into concepts from Art 1 & 2, and learning new content through personal research. Students will learn and apply the elements and principles of design to produce creative art projects that reflect their understanding of these concepts. Visual Art is an important part of a student's education. Students are challenged to find creative and unique solutions to problems. It is this use of creative problem solving skills that fosters higher level thinking skills. Art also offers students the opportunity to work cooperatively, to be responsible, and to appreciate other cultures and the world around them. Primarily, student will be creating a portfolio of their work that best represents them, their skills, and knowledge.

Objectives for Portfolio:

- To *master* the Principles & Elements of Design on a higher level.
- To *hone* technical skills and craftsmanship that creating quality artwork requires.
- To *learn* how to discuss and critique artwork that is your own, your peers, and famous works.
- To *familiarize* your self with art terms that applies in society today.
- To *improve* motor function and hand-eye coordination.
- To *practice* patience, visual application, and openness to healthy, effective criticism.
- To *appreciate* the creative process.
- To *develop* skills required for creative problem solving.
- To Improve in your *skills, ability, and understanding* from Art 1 and Art 2
- To *create* a Portfolio of work geared towards your own interests, abilities, and style.

Rules:

1. Come to class on time, and prepared
2. Listen the first time
3. Use class time wisely and efficiently
4. Treat others and materials with respect
5. There is no eating food or drinks without sealed lids
6. You may not be on your phones during class time without teacher permission
7. All materials used must be properly cleaned and put away

Rules broken: First offense the student will be asked to correct. Second time Student will be asked to correct, materials may be confiscated, and parent/guardian will be notified. Third time you will be sent to Dr. Gregory to receive a referral.

Chromebooks: Students are expected to have their school provided Chromebook every day to use as their classroom device. All research and digital classwork will be on these devices. Cell phone privileges will be limited to music only and will be taken away if used otherwise.

If you miss class: It is the STUDENTS responsibility to check for work that needs to be made up. Stop in or email and ask what you need to do to stay caught up on the project, classwork, etc. For excused absences, extra time will be given on projects and assignments if needed. Again, you are responsible for getting the work you missed!!

Mastery Learning: If your grade drops below a 75 for the class you are **required** to attend office hours. If a student makes below a 75 on a quiz they may retake the quiz for partial credit within a week of getting their grade back. For Projects I have a late policy: *Late work will have 5 points taken off the first day, and 10 points off every day after! (incomplete work is graded very harshly, so the late work policy is encouraged.)

Materials:

- 1 sketchbook 8.5x11 or 9 x 12 (book bound preferred)
- Multiple #2 pencils
- Erasers
- 1 small roll of scotch tape with dispenser
- 1 glue stick
- 2 ultra-thin tipped sharpies
- 1 small pencil pouch (please not too big!)
 - This will hold everything BUT the sketchbook
 - This will STAY in the art room – not for other classes.
- 24 x 36 Art Portfolio case
- Students will be asked to or given the option to provide materials later in the year for specific units

Class Grades:

- 35% - Projects
- 30% - Artist Research
- 25% - Sketchbook
- 10% - Classwork
 - 45% for Semester 1 and 2 grades
 - 10% of semester final grade - Midterm/Final Exam

Art Shows: All art and music students are required to attend these events and stay to support the other arts.

- **Winter Concert/Art Show December 7th 7pm – Art 1, Art 2, and Portfolio 1 & 2**
- **Guitar/Chorus/Art Show May 7th 7pm – Art 1**
- **Band/Orch/Art Show May 14th 7pm – Art 2 and Portfolio 1 & 2**

Contract: As an Art student you will be expected to show your work outside of regular school hours. Our winter concert/art show and our spring showcase/art show both count as a major grade. We will not be able to make these dates up unless there is an unforeseen emergency. Please put these 2 dates on your calendar and make sure your parents are aware of this as well.
